Mike Plotnikoff passed away suddenly at his home, on Friday, April 27, 2012. He was 82 years old.

Mike was born on July 21, 1929 in Castlegar, BC. It was here in Castlegar where he grew up, had all his schooling, raised a family and lived his whole life.
